April Program – Election Integrity

The Ellis County Republican Women will convene at 6:30p.m. on Tuesday, April 11, 2023 at the Waxahachie Chamber of Commerce, 102 YMCA Dr. in Waxahachie.

Our election system is broken. There have been widespread cases of fraudulent activity that has occurred with elections in various areas of our great state, and in other states across our country as well. What is being done about this?

Multiple bills have been filed in the Texas House and the Senate to make our elections safe and secure. Just last month the Texas Senate passed a bill to make illegal voting a felony again. This is good, and this is a start, but there is so much more that can be done. *See Program Page 3*

Remember the Battle of San Jacinto

Sam Houston said just before the Battle of San Jacinto: We view ourselves on the eve of battle. We are nerved for the contest, and must conquer or perish. It is vain to look for present aid; none is at hand. We must now act or abandon all hope! Rally to the standard and be no longer the scoff of mercenary tongues! Be men, be free men, that our children may bless their father's name.

On April 21, 1836, with cries of "Remember the Alamo! Remember Goliad!" General Houston and his ragged band of 910 men surprised the Mexican army under the command of President Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna who was encamped on the San Jacinto River. About 630 of the Mexican soldiers were killed and 30 wounded.

It is written that: "Measured by its results, San Jacinto was one of the decisive battles of the world. The freedom of Texas from Mexico won here led to annexation and to the Mexican American War resulting in the acquisition by the United States of Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, California, Utah and parts of Colorado, Wyoming, Kansas and Oklahoma. Almost one-third of the present area of the American nation, nearly a million square miles of territory, changed sovereignty."

Today, the San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site commemorates the battle and includes the San Jacinto Monument, the world's tallest memorial column. The monument is a 570-foot shaft topped by a 34-foot star symbolizing the Lone Star Republic.

The 1,200-acre San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site, which is also a national Historic Landmark, consists of the Battleground, Monument and Battleship Texas. It is located in La Porte, not far from Houston and well worth a visit.
